# Post-crisis Cooperation Agreements

- ❑ **Joint Declaration** on Post-Crisis Assessments and Recovery Planning (UNDG – World Bank and EC)

signed 25 September 2008

- ❑ United Nations – World Bank **Partnership Framework** for Crisis and Post-Crisis Situations

October 2008

- ❑ United Nations Development Group – World Bank Post-Crisis **Operational Annex**

signed 24 October 2008

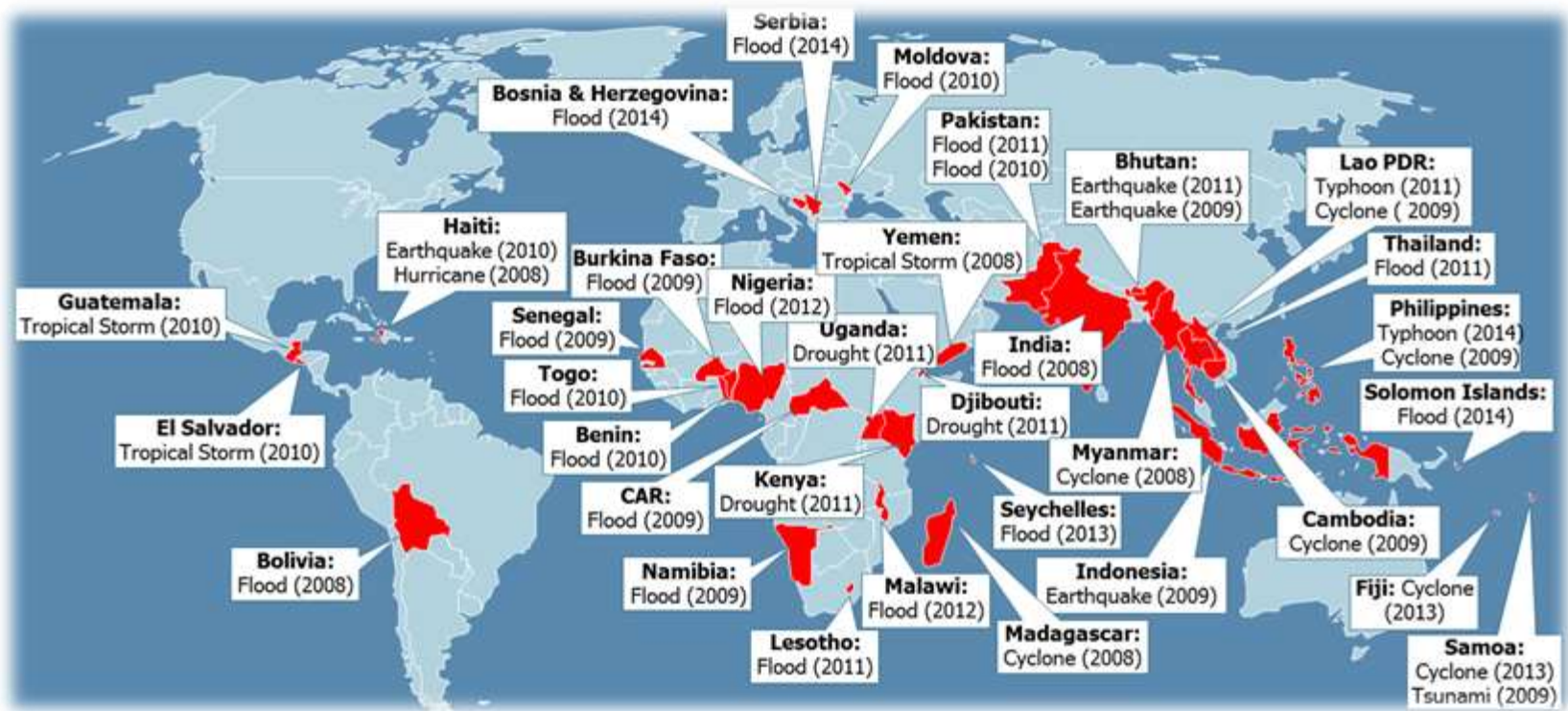
# Rationale for Partnership

- In post disaster scenarios, the sheer number of assessment conducted, coupled with diverse methodologies and approaches brings confusion and does not help recovery planning.
- PDNA promotes a harmonized and comprehensive assessment to support National Governments.
- Avoids duplicative, repetitive assessments from different stakeholders and partners.

## Impact of the 2008 Declaration on Post-Crisis Assessments and Recovery Planning:

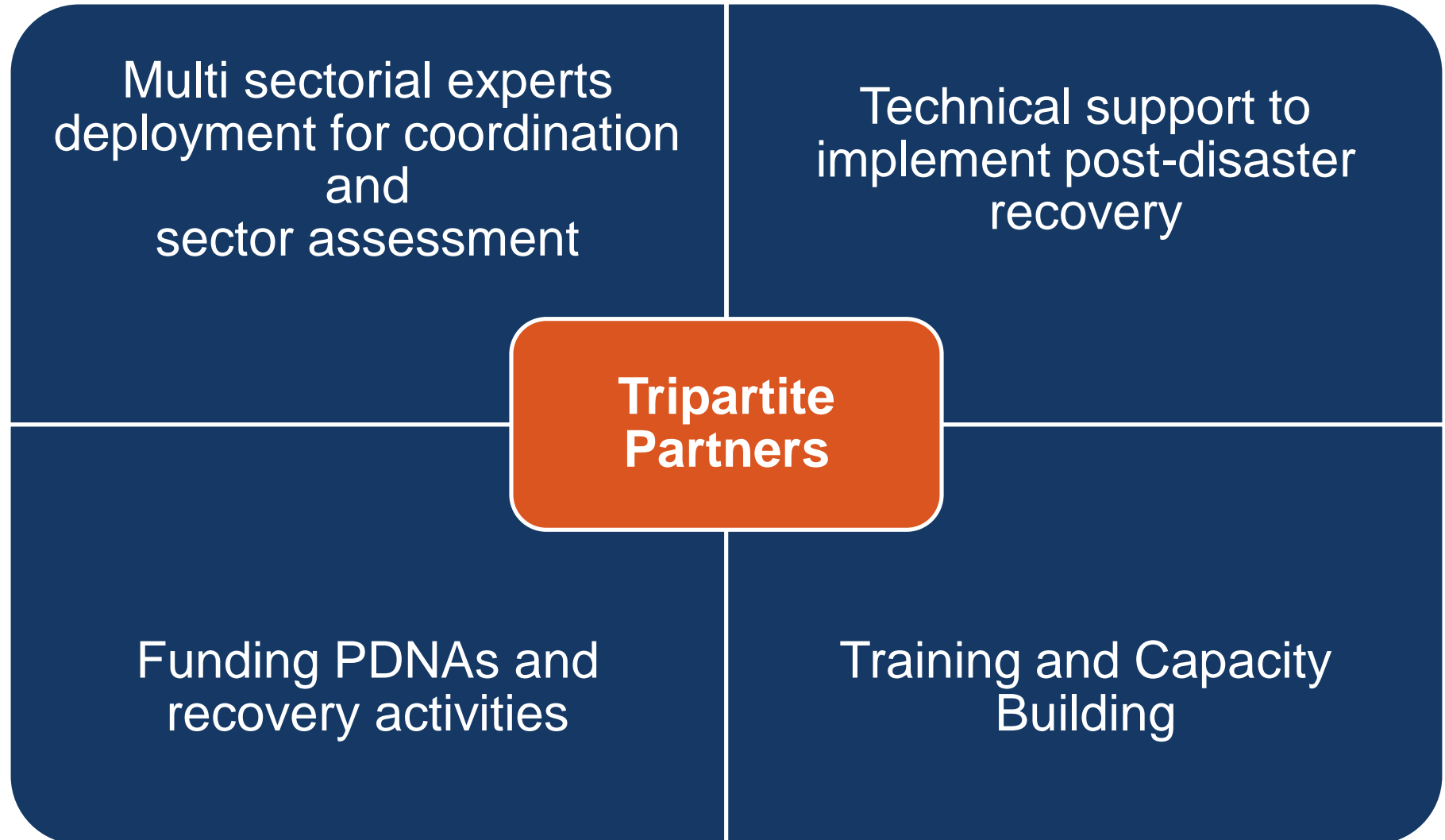


Today, the PDNA is a globally applied tool. Since 2008 over **50 assessments** have been conducted in more than **46 countries (as of April 2018)**

# Role of the National Government in the Assessment

<b>Leadership and Coordination</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Designates a <b>lead agency</b> to anchor the PDNA process.</li><li>• Brings together all national institutions and international actors under a <b>joint process</b>.</li></ul>
<b>Data Collection &amp; access to information</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Facilitates <b>pre disaster data</b> collection from national and institutional data bases, and <b>post disaster data</b> from the affected areas.</li></ul>
<b>Provides Logistics support</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Space for <b>PDNA secretariat</b>.</li><li>• Facilities for workshops and <b>consultations</b>.</li></ul>
<b>Reviews and endorses the PDNA report</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Reviews all <b>sector reports</b> for accuracy and guides the formulation of the <b>recovery strategy</b>.</li><li>• Approves the report at the highest office.</li><li>• Allocates resources, presents report for international assistance.</li></ul>

Sector	Sub - Sectors
<b>Social sectors</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Housing, land and settlements (UN-Habitat)</li><li>• Education (UNICEF)</li><li>• Health (WHO)</li><li>• Culture (UNESCO)</li></ul>
<b>Productive sectors</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Agriculture, fisheries and livestock (FAO)</li><li>• Employment and livelihoods (ILO)</li></ul>
<b>Infrastructure sectors</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Water and sanitation (UNICEF)</li><li>• Community infrastructure (UNDP)</li></ul>
<b>Cross-cutting</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• DRR (UNDP)</li><li>• Governance (UNDP)</li><li>• Gender (UN Women)</li><li>• Environment (UNEP)</li></ul>



# PDNA Activation

## Disaster

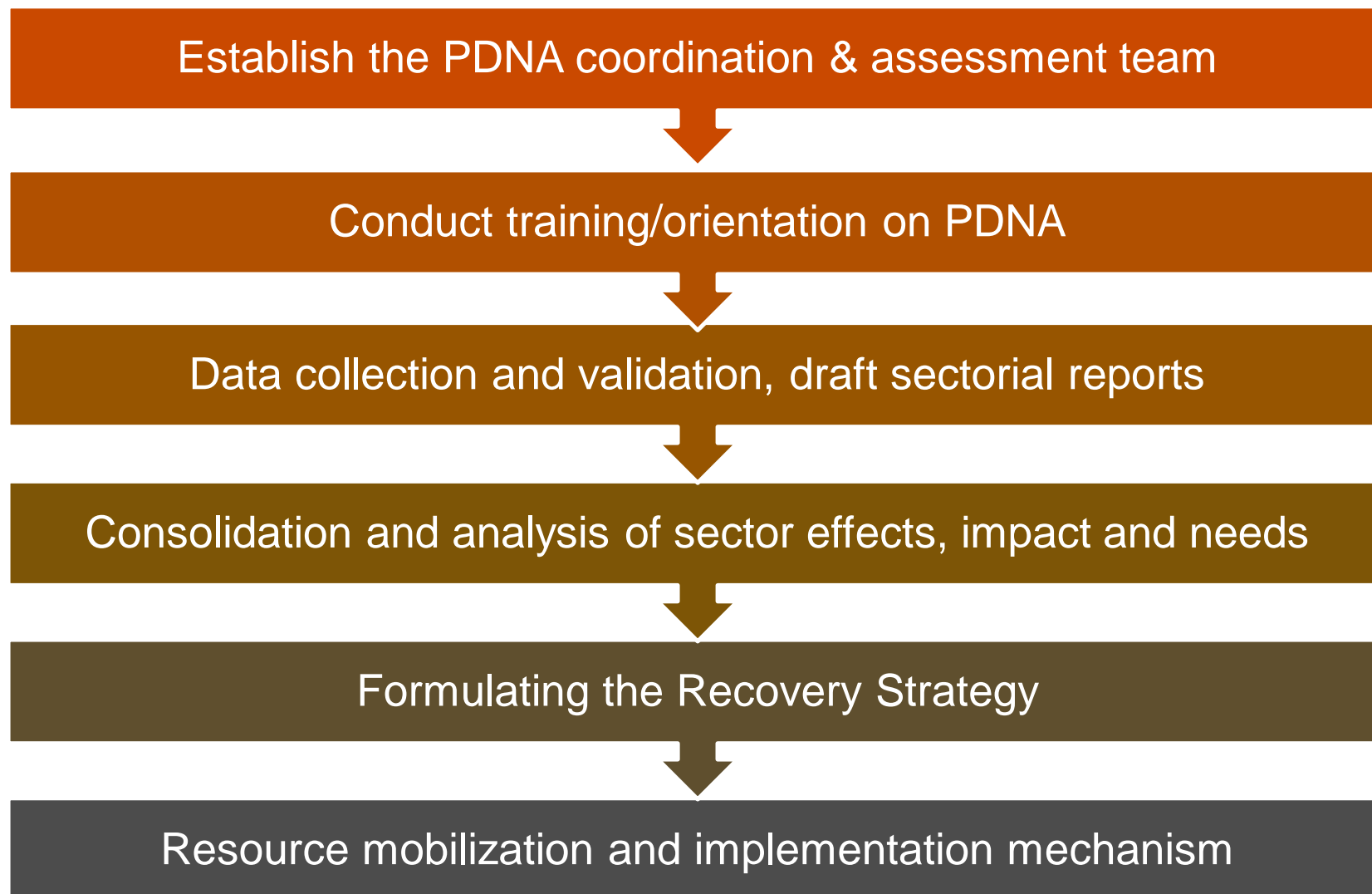
In country communication between EU, WB, UN of a possible request for a PDNA, reported immediately to HQ.

Official request from the Government and joint decision to activate a PDNA including the designation of the national lead ministry.

Deployment of a Planning Mission and formulation of the TORs for the PDNA.

Definition of the support that Government and partners will provide to the process.
