Comprehensive Framework for Disaster Management







Background



- Post Indian Ocean Tsunami (Dec. 2004) Special Session of SAARC Environment
 Ministers was held in Male in June 2005 (Male Declaration)
- Subsequently, India proposed to have a SAARC DM Centre in India proposal accepted in the Thirteen SAARC Summit held at Dhaka in Nov. 2005
- SAARC Comprehensive Framework for Disaster Management (SCFDM)
 was articulated and discussed during Expert Group Meeting (Dhaka, 7-9
 February 2006)
- Endorsed by the Seventh Meeting of the SAARC Environment Ministers
 (Dhaka, 24 May 2006)
- SCFDM was aligned with Hyogo Framework of Action (HFA 2005 2015)



Objectives



- Establish and strengthen the Regional Disaster Management System to reduce risks and to improve response and recovery management at all levels;
- Identify and elaborate country and regional priorities for action;
- Share best practices and lessons learnt from disaster risk reduction efforts at national levels;
- Establish a regional system to develop and implement regional programmes and projects for early warning;
- Establish a regional system of *exchanging information* on prevention, preparedness and management of natural disasters;
- Create a *regional response mechanism* dedicated to disaster preparedness,
 emergency relief and rehabilitation to ensure immediate response; and
- Create a regional mechanism to facilitate monitoring and evaluation of achievements towards goals and strategies.



Expected Outcomes



- An efficient *Disaster Management System*;
- Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction into the development policies and practices of the government at all levels;
- Disaster resilient communities that have *enhanced coping capacities* in relation to all hazards;
- Development of policies and programmes that recognizes all risks to the communities, and mitigation strategies that are based on a risk management assessment;
- Greater levels of *Coordination* and *Cooperation* at national, regional and international levels; and
- Enhanced information, warning and reporting systems within governments at all levels.



Strategic Goals



- Professionalising the disaster management system;
- Mainstreaming disaster risk reduction
- Strengthening of community institutional mechanisms;
- Empowering community at risk particularly women, the poor and the disadvantaged;
- Expanding risk *reduction* programming *across* a broader range of hazards (all hazards approach);
- Strengthening emergency response systems; and
- Developing and strengthening *networks* of relevant national, regional and international organizations.



Priorities of Action



- Based on recommendations of the HFA, Directives of SAARC meetings and the Dhaka Declaration 2005 of the 13th SAARC Summit
- 6 Priorities of Action were designed for period of 2006 2015
- General Considerations
 - Poverty reduction and sustainable development
 - Advocate & Adopt comprehensive approach to risk Reduction and DM
 - Integration of research outputs within development planning and community risk reduction strategies
 - Engage Govt. systems for risk Reduction and DM through Mainstreaming
 - Policy and framework for across governments sustainable coordination
 - Partnership with Govt., Civil society, Private Sector and other stakeholders
 - Emphasis on issues of Gender and Disadvantaged
 - Strong regional partnership and networks for DRR
 - Training Curriculum development; high level Professional development
 - Learning from traditional and indigenous coping mechanism



Broad Priorities of Action



- 1. Develop and implement risk reduction strategies
- 2. Establish regional and national response mechanism
- Establish a regional information sharing and develop network of institutions and organisations
- 4. Develop and implement disaster management training, education, research and awareness programs
- 5. Apply the ICT for disaster management
- 6. Establish an effective monitoring and evaluation mechanism



Why Updation/ Alignment?



- Emphasis on Disaster Risk Management v/s Disaster Management
- Quantification of targets based on definition of seven global targets in SFDRR
- Strategies for states focused on preventing new risk, reducing existing risk and strengthening resilience
- All-of-society and all-of-State institutions approach
- Broadened scope of Disaster Risk: Natural and Human Induced hazards and related environmental, technological and biological hazards and risks.
- Promotion of preparedness of Critical Infrastructure



Why Updation/Alignment?



- Emphasis on improved understanding of disaster risk in all its dimensions of exposure, vulnerability and hazard characteristics;
- Accountability of stakeholders for disaster risk management; preparedness to "Build Back Better";
- Institutionalization of risk-sensitive investment to avoid the creation of new risk;
- Emphasis on resilience of health infrastructure, cultural heritage and workplaces;
- Strengthening of international cooperation and global partnership,
- Set of indicators to measure the progress in achieving the global targets of SFDRR

Major Challenges



Major Challenges



- SDMC as 'Interim Unit'
- Unavailability of effective and uniform Disaster Information
 System lack of Baseline Data
- Lack of Understanding of Risk Unplanned construction, town planning, Population growth, Climate change etc. increases the vulnerability).
- Lack of Financial and Technical support to enhances DRR efforts.
- Resource Constraints
- Ensure balance between SFDRR (alongwith other global framework),
 SAARC Charter (ensure unanimity and sovereignty) and National &
 Local DRR Strategies of the respective Member States

- □ Technical support from UNDRR (10 principles)/ Others
- Preparatory Drafting
- Inputs on the Draft Framework
- Approval through SAARC Process
