DRAWING ON DRR ACTS AND PROVISION

 Declaration of Disaster or Emergency triggered Government response to the pandemic – access to resources and personnel necessary for the response

 Civil Protection, paramilitary forces under Disaster Management agencies put into commission to support pandemic response

Joint Institutional Management

- In several countries, COVID -19 was jointly managed by NDMA (Ministry of Home Affairs) and Ministry of Health for reasons ---
- Maintenance of law and order, enforcement of guidelines
- Implementation of provisions under the emergency management act.
- Human Resources for procurement, construction of hospitals,
- Facilitating compensation claims for COVID-19 deaths
- Procurement of medical supplies, including oxygen
- SOP for International and national travel

Risk Communication

 Preparation of Guidelines and SOPs for management and response to COVID-19. India NDMA has for example with MoH has 12 videos on topics ranging from Home isolation, Use of Masks, to safety in schools and safety in public transport, taking care of elders, etc

- Guidelines on vaccine, information on access to vaccines
- Guidelines on containment measures

Daily COVID -19 Advisories and Updates

Guides, Advisory and Actions

- Activation of the crisis coordination bodies and mechanisms,
- Mobilization of experts bodies and emergency responders, activation of the NDMAs emergency operation centres and situation rooms for better planning and coordination of resources,
- Support and provision of the business continuity, constant assessment and needs prioritization,
- Implementation of restrictive measures to prevent the spread of the disease, imposing of quarantine and isolation measures,
- Preventive measures for disinfection,
- Crisis communication with the general public and the citizens,
- Allocation of COVID-19 response funds, etc.
